

Campus Crusade for Christ is becoming Cru

This month at that Campus Crusade for Christ (CCC) US Staff Conference in Ft. Collins CO, CCC VP Steve Sellers announced that in early 2012 CCC will be changing its name to "Cru". This change is being made because the words "Campus" and "Crusade" in the current name are creating barriers to the fulfillment of our mission to reach the world for Christ.

"Campus" confuses those who interact with parts of CCC (like FamilyLife) not dealing with college students. Over the years, "Crusade" has come to be more associated with the Middle Ages than with the evangelistic crusades that were so prevalent when CCC was formed in 1951. In fact, research shows that 1 in 5 people approached for a spiritual conversation lose interest when they hear the name of the organization is Campus Crusade for Christ.

Some in the media have tried to imply that CCC leadership is seeking to distance itself from Christ with this name change. We agree that Christian organizations must not back away from their allegiance to Christ and the centrality of the gospel. Cru has not wavered in their commitment to Christ or their willingness to stand for Him. The mission of CCC/Cru has been and will always be the fulfillment of the Great Commission to make disciples of Christ from all nations.

As for removing Christ from their name, Cru addressed the question in the following statement: We were not trying to eliminate the word Christ from our name. We were looking for a name that would most effectively serve our mission and help us take the gospel to the world. Our mission has not changed. Cru enables us to have discussions about Christ with people who might initially be turned off by a more overtly Christian name. We believe that our interaction and our communication with the world will be what ultimately honors and glorifies Christ.''

Bill Bright, the founder of Campus Crusade, considered changing the name 20-25 years ago, according to Vonette Bright. The ministry has grown way beyond a campus ministry, but the name still gives that impression.

This name change **does not mean that FamilyLife will be changing its name**. If you are supporting us financially, you may continue to make checks payable to Campus Crusade for Christ. Those of you giving by electronic means, you do not need to change anything. You may see more information over the next several months on this change.

Please know that the name change was not made lightly, but was bathed in prayer over time. "Cru" is a nickname that has been used for years. The change does not alter the mission and focus of the ministry. Cru will continue with evangelism and Christian outreaches to the world.
