Dear Ministry Partner,

We never know when God is going to get right in our face and teach us a lesson. I (Jennifer) had this experience this past fall when I got a spiritual lesson from a dog. I know it sounds strange, but while on my jog in the park God used an old man and his dog to teach me an important lesson.

As I was jogging in the park an old man who was training his dog to walk with him caught my attention. The dog was a little fur ball of energy, jittering with excitement as they walked through the park. He was not at all interested in walking with the old man. He was instead interested in everything else at the park and was barking at birds, sniffing rocks, watching other people and running ahead of his owner.



The old man was so patient, each time the dog got too far away, he gently pulled the leash back in. When the dog was by his side he would take a few steps and then stop. The old man looked down to make sure the dog was in step with him. He would then take a few more steps and stop. The old man just wanted the dog to walk with him, to go where he led, and to stop when he stopped.

I realized that this is no different than what God wants from us...to walk with HIM. God wants us to follow Him and be in-step with Him wherever He leads.

Shortly after my walk I was reading Psalm 143 and I found several phrases that contained this same idea. Verses 8-9 say, "Show me the way I should go, for to you I lift up my soul... for I hide myself in you. Teach me to do your will, for you are my God; may your good Spirit lead me on level ground."

The phrase, "I hide myself in you" stuck out to me. I pictured myself at God's side, hiding in the fold of His robe. What a peaceful place to be. I have now started praying for God to *shorten my leash*. God, don't let me get too far away from You, pull me closer to Your side, wrap me up in the fold of Your robe.

This is our prayer for you this year. As we begin 2012, we pray that God will **shorten His leash on you.** We pray that you will feel the peace of being by God's side, and that you will follow His lead. He will show you where to go, step by step.
