Some of you may have already heard the news. But for those of you who haven't; FamilyLife suffered a great loss in the tornado that swept through Arkansas on Sunday April 27. Two families were profoundly impacted.

The Tiddle Family: Fellow FamilyLife staff member Rob Tiddle and his 2 daughters Tori and Rebekah were killed in the tornado. Rob's wife, Kerry, and their 7 other children miraculously survived the storm, but their house was demolished.

The night of the storm The Tittles' 19-year-old daughter posted this on Facebook from a friend's house: "... my mom, and my six brothers/sisters are alright. We have lost three of our family ... Dad, Tori and Rebekah, prayers would be appreciated. The house is gone stripped from the foundation. The Lord Gives and the Lord Takes away, Blessed be the Name of the Lord."

Dan and Kristin: Another fellow FamilyLife staff lost their home and their two cars.

With about 10 minutes' warning, they were able to see the tornado approaching and moved their six children and four pets into the master bedroom closet, which was constructed as a tornado safe room.
